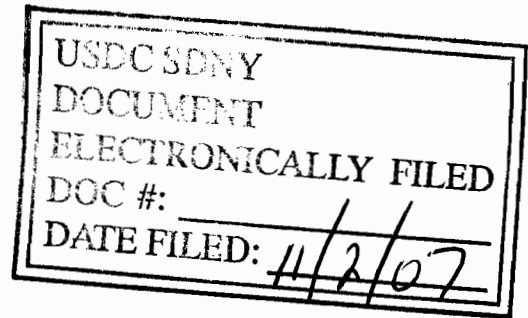

ORDER

GERARD E. LYNCH, District Judge:

Defendant George Sandhu having submitted a letter, dated October 3, 2007, seeking various types of discovery relief, and the parties having argued the matter before the Court on October 12, 2007, and the SEC having produced certain documents for *in camera* review pursuant to the Court's direction on that date, it is hereby ORDERED that:

1. Defendant Sandhu's application is denied in all respects, except to the extent of the Court's directive that the SEC submit certain documents for *in camera* review, for the reasons stated on the record in open court on October 12, 2007.


2. Upon review of those documents, the Court finds them to be privileged attorney work product, and finds no basis for overcoming the privilege. Defendant Sandhu's request that the materials be produced to him is therefore denied.

3. The Clerk of Court is respectfully directed to docket and file defendant Sandhu's submission of October 3, 2007.

4. The documents submitted by the SEC for *in camera* review will be filed under seal.
